

## Things to remember

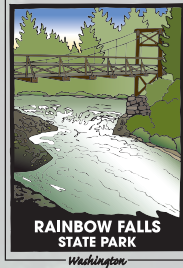
- **Park hours** – 6:30 a.m. to dusk April 1 to Sept. 30.
  - **Winter schedule** – 8 a.m. to dusk Oct. 1 - March 31. Although most parks are open year round, some parks or portions of parks are closed during the winter. For a winter schedule and information about seasonal closures, visit [www.parks.state.wa.us](http://www.parks.state.wa.us) or call the information center at (360) 902-8844.
  - Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited. Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
  - One camping party is allowed per site. Maximum of eight people per campsite.
  - Campsites may not be held for other parties.
  - Camping check-in time is 2:30 p.m., and check-out time is 1 p.m.
  - Extra vehicle overnight - \$10 per night in designated area.
- Only one extra vehicle per site.** Does not apply to vehicle towed by a recreational vehicle.
- Pets must be on leash and under physical control at all times. This includes trail areas and campsites. Pet owners must clean up after pets on all state park lands.
  - Quiet hours are 10 p.m. to 6:30 a.m.
  - Engine-driven electric generators may be operated only between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m.

**The Discover Pass** is required for day visits to state parks and access to other state-managed recreation lands. The pass provides access to millions of acres of parks, wildlife areas, trails, natural areas and water-access sites. The annual pass is transferable between two vehicles.

- Annual pass: \$30 • One-day pass: \$10 (transaction and dealer fees may apply)

# Rainbow Falls

**Rainbow Falls State Park is situated in stands of old-growth forest on the Chehalis River. This 139-acre camping park features 3,400 feet of freshwater shoreline and a rainbow-crowned waterfall, which gives the park its name.**

**In the heart of a dense forest, the park features a small fuchsia garden with more than 40 varieties of fuchsia. The park also has a self-guided nature walk through old-growth forest and access to the mixed use long-distance Willapa Hills State Park Trail which runs through Rainbow Falls from Chehalis to Pe El. Swimming, fishing and hiking are popular activities at the park.**

#### Overnight accommodations

The park offers several options for overnight stays. There are 40 standard campsites, eight utility campsites that accommodate RVs up to 60 feet long and five primitive campsites. Three primitive campsites are designated for hikers and bicyclists and two are for horse campers. All campsites are first come, first served.

A group camp is reservable for up to 14 camping units and 60 campers. Two RV hookups with only water also are available. To reserve the group camp, call the park at (360) 291-3767.

#### Park amenities and facilities

Rainbow Falls State Park offers several amenities and facilities to make your visit more enjoyable and comfortable, including:

- Group day-use kitchen shelter with electricity, water and 15 picnic tables (up to 50 people), Reservable by calling the park at (360) 291-3767
- Group day-use kitchen shelter without electricity or water, available on a first-come, first-served basis
- 21 unsheltered picnic tables are available first come, first served
- One softball field, two horseshoe pits
- One restroom and two showers
- Trailer dump station
