#### Things to remember

- Park hours April 1 to Sept. 30, 8 a.m. to dusk.
- Winter schedule Oct. 1 to March 31, 8 a.m. to dusk. Although most parks are open year round, some parks or portions

of parks are closed during the winter. For a winter schedule and information about seasonal closures, visit www.parks.state.wa.us or call the information center at (360) 902-8844.

- · Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited. Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
- Pets must be on leash and under physical control at all times. This includes trail areas and campsites. Pet owners must clean up after pets on all state park lands.
- Wood fires are not permitted in the campground.

The Discover Pass is required for day visits to state parks and access to other state-managed recreation lands. The pass provides access to millions of acres of parks, wildlife areas, trails, natural areas and water-access sites. The annual pass is transferable between two vehicles.

• Annual pass: \$30 • One-day pass: \$10 (transaction and dealer fees may apply)

## WELCOME TO SALTWATER

Saltwater State
Park is a
picturesque
park situated
along the
shores of
Puget Sound.
It features
1,445 feet of
saltwater shoreline

and is located halfway between the cities of Tacoma and Seattle. The park offers beautiful views and wildlife-watching opportunities.

Saltwater is the only state park that features an underwater, artificial reef on Puget Sound. Visitors may explore a wonderful diversity of sea life and marine environments, including tide pools and salmon spawning in McSorley Creek.

Visitors also may enjoy exploring the trails on foot, fishing, sailboarding, bird watching or simply relaxing.

Campground is open from May 15 to Sept. 15 with reservations, campers without a reservation may only stay one night at a time.

Please note: Alcohol is not permitted at Saltwater State Park. This policy is strictly enforced throughout the park, including reserved picnic shelters.

#### Park amenities and facilities

Saltwater State Park offers several amenities and facilities to make your visit more enjoyable and comfortable, including:

- Two shelters can accommodate 50 guests each. The shelters are reservable by calling [888] 226-7688.
- 147 unsheltered picnic tables. Most picnic sites. are near the beach or along McSorley Creek.
- One volleyball field and two fire circles.
- 2 miles of hiking trails.
