
## THINGS TO REMEMBER

- Park hours- May 1 to Sept. 30. 8 a.m. to dusk.
   Winter schedule: 8 a.m. to dusk. For information about seasonal closures, visit parks.wa.gov.
- Reservations can be made up to nine months ahead online at <u>washington.goingtocamp.com</u> or by calling 888-CAMPOUT. Unreserved sites are available first come, first served (site information available at the registration booth).
- There's a 10-day camping limit between April 1 and Sept. 30. The rest of the year is a 20-day limit.
- Wildlife, plants and all park buildings, signs, tables and other structures are protected; removal or damage of any kind is prohibited.
- Hunting, feeding of wildlife and gathering firewood on state park property is prohibited.
   Fallen branches and debris need to be left on the forest floor to decay and nourish the plants and trees. Firewood is for sale at the camp host site.
- One camping party (a max of eight people) per site. Campsites may not be held for other parties.
- Camping check-in time is 2:30 p.m. and check-out time is 1 p.m.
- One vehicle allowed at each campsite. Extra
  vehicles are \$10 per night and must be parked in
  a designated area (or at the site if there's room
  on the parking pad). This doesn't apply to vehicle
  towed by a recreational vehicle.
- Pets must be on leash and under control at all times. This includes trail areas and campsites.
   Pet owners, including horse riders, must clean up after pets on all state park lands. Doggy bags are located throughout the park.
- Engine-driven electric generators may be operated only between the hours of 8 a.m. and 9 p.m.





## SCHAFER STATE PARK

Schafer State Park is a forested camping park on the Satsop River near Olympia in southwest Washington.

This 113-acre camping park is popular with anglers for sea-run cutthroat trout in summer, salmon in the fall and steelhead in late winter. Visitors may enjoy exploring 2 miles of hiking trails, wildlife viewing, swimming & wading.

## **Overnight accommodations**

The park offers several options for overnight stays. There are 29 standard campsites, 34 partial utility sites that accommodate RVs up to 40' long, 4 walk-in sites and 1 primitive site for hikers and bicyclers. 52 sites are reservable and 15 are first come, first served. There is also a group camp that accommodates up to 70 guests. The group camp features a covered picnic shelter with a wood stove, fire ring, vault toilets, picnic tables and barbeques.
